



Physical Distancing Framework

Current as of September 30, 2020

The framework outlined below guides the University through a phased re-opening of campus, as conditions on campus and in the community warrant. The University can resort to a prior, more stringent stage as needed. This framework is subject to change. Request for exceptions to any of the guidelines should be directed to the [COVID Coordinator](#).

Foundational Requirements

In order to support a residential population, the University must be able to quickly set up safe and efficient screening and testing sites for symptomatic individuals and support contact tracing of individuals that test positive for COVID-19.

Planning Assumptions

- The Governor implemented a three-phase approach to reopening the Commonwealth of Virginia.

- A staged approach to reopening the campus balances the benefits and potential harms of adjusting these measures, so as not to trigger a resurgence of COVID-19 cases and jeopardize the health and safety of the campus community.
- The risk of transmission depends on both the type and duration of exposure, as well as protective measures.
- Physical distance is the most effective way to prevent the exposure to COVID-19, followed by engineering and then administrative controls.
- Growing evidence demonstrates that the use of face coverings, coupled with physical distancing may reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission although the use of face coverings requires consistent access to supplies and continuous, proper use by individuals.
- Relaxing restrictions too quickly may lead to a spike in cases.
- The University offered formal education/training regarding COVID-19 to faculty, staff, and students.

Forward Virginia

In May, the Governor implemented, [Forward Virginia](#), a three phased approach to reopening the Commonwealth of Virginia. Phase Three of the Governor’s plan went into effect July 1, 2020. The [Phase Three Forward Virginia Guidelines](#), [Safer at Home](#), outline guidelines for all business sectors including best practices for physical distancing, cleaning and disinfection, as well as enhanced workplace safety. The health and safety of

the Spider Community remains the University’s priority. The University moved to the Red Stage after implementing the recommendations within this framework and complying with the requirements identified within the Forward Virginia Guidelines, including the [reopening guidance developed specifically for institutions of higher education](#). The University’s implementation of each stage will correspond generally with the Forward Virginia re-opening phases of the Com-

monwealth, but the University may implement more stringent guidelines or to set a different pace for relaxing guidelines as warranted by the needs of the campus community. The Potential University Readiness Conditions within each Stage indicate the minimum requirements the University must meet before moving to the next Stage. The resumption of activities will be gradual and phased based on local public health conditions as well as institutional capacity.
